The year that was

Key Results Achieved

- 1) Sixteen residents, inducted from Government Mental Hospital, Thirteen were rehabilitated with their families, residing in Bangladesh, Uttar Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, North 24 Parganas, South 24 Parganas, Birbhum and Howrah.
- 2) Six relapsed ex-residents were discharged after being treated for various durations.
- 3) Seven short stay patients, inducted and seven rehabilitated with their families.

4) Repatriation: Smt. Asma Morol aged about 25 years of age hails from Khulna district, Bangladesh. Asma came to India and police rescued her and admitted to Caluctta Pavlov Hospital on 1st June 2019.

Asma was brought to Paripurnata on 6th September 2022. With our treatment, Asma recovered a lot. We contacted Bangladesh Deputy High Commission. Asma was officially repatriated on 15th September 2023 with the cooperation of Deputy High Commission and Special Task Force of Directorate of Child Trafficking. She was officially handed over to Bangladesh High Commission on 15th September' 2023 which was amply covered by print & TV Channel. Media coverage in 'News Eighteen' TV Channel.

Report on activities 2023-24

<u>REHABILITATION</u>

The ongoing residential programme of *Psycho-social Rehabilitation of Mentally ill Women* was conducted simultaneously in three streams :

- i) Rehabilitation programme of 9-12 months for women belonging to the marginalized sections, inducted from Calcutta Pavlov Hospital.
- ii) Rehabilitation months for our ex-residents, who have relapsed, due to factors like, not taking the prescribed medicines and negligence / ill treatment by family members.
- iii) Short stay programme of 4-6 months for women belonging to lower middle class families.

ACTIVITIES CARRIED OUT

Pharmaco – therapy: Psychiatric treatment with psychotropic medicines as required were regularly carried out by the psychiatrist.

Psychological counseling : Psychological counselling were rendered to all the residents, as applicable. Periodic group therapy sessions and mental state examinations were conducted periodically.

Physical check-up: A general physician regularly carried out check-ups of all the residents and if required prescribed diagnostic and clinical examinations.

Occupational therapy: Training in basic domestic skills like, cleaning, washing, personal hygiene & grooming were imparted every day. Training sessions on stitching, sewing and block printing were held as planned.

Socio-cultural therapy: Therapies in the form of music, dancing, painting & yoga were imparted as planned. To inculcate social skills like, receiving visitors, social interactions and shopping etc. were conducted regularly.

Non-formal education : Classes on general knowledge, current affairs, storytelling and basic human rights were held.

PARALLEL ACTIVITIES CARRIED OUT

Home Visits: The visits were carried out as required to the homes of the residents for exchanging information and sensitizing the family members. Visits were also made to the homes of the exresidents as follow-up measures.

During this year, 38 such families were visited.

In quite a few cases, our Managing Committee members joined the Psychiatric Social Worker / Psychologist, in visiting these families located in the outlaying parts of West Bengal.

Ex-residents Meets were held as scheduled to discuss about their health issues, compatibility with their families, along with their livelihood problems and sharing of experiences with their peers.

Two meets were held on 29th April and 8th October 2023 respectively, in which 30 & 29 ex-residents respectively and all M.C. Member of Paripurnata were invited, they interacted with them along with their family members.

Keeping in mind, the ensuing *Darga-puja* festivities, the ex-residents present, were given Gift of Hampers comprising stainless steel crockeries & utensils, cooking oil, blankets, sarees & accessories.

They were also given ₹1000/- in cash

Family Meets were organized to exchange views on the mental health status of the residents and ex-residents for enhancement of skills of the family members as care givers.

OPDs were conducted weekly for the ex-residents and prescribed medicines were given free of cost. Psychiatric patients from the community were also given free consultation and prescriptions.



RELATED ACTIVITIES

Staff-Instructors Meets were periodically organized to discuss the feedbacks of the instructors. There were exchanges of ideas for making the occupational therapies more meaningful.



Two meets were held on 21st December 2023, in which 7 Instructors along with 2 Programme Staffs and 26th February 2024, in which 6 Instructors along with the Hony. Secretary & 2 Programme Staffs were present. Progress of various planned activities and their impact on the residents were discussed.

House-Staff Meetings were held at regular intervals to discuss about the problems they faced in their day to day work. The programme staff assessed the individual performance of each house staff and instructed them accordingly.

A meeting for house staff was held on 2nd June 2023, in which 6 House Staff members, Programme Staff and Accountant cum administrative Assistant attended the meeting. Our Hony. Secretary presided over the meet. Various issues and problem area which were thoroughly discussed and resolved in amicable manner.

Staff Meeting: A Staff meeting with Managing Committee (M.C.) was held on 16th February 2024, in which 13 staff members along with 5 M.C. members were present. Mr. Asok Kumar Sil, as M.C. Member presided over the meet and interacted with the individual staff member. Various issues were raised by staff which were thoroughly discussed and resolved in amicable manner.

OUTING, PICNIC & CELEBRATION

Rabindra Jayanti: 162nd Birth Anniversary of the poet Rabindranath Tagore was observed on 10th May 2023 in our Auditorium. The programme began with rendition of Rabindra Sangeet by the Residents. This was followed by a Cultural Programme. The residents paid homage to the poet by reciting poems, singing *Rabindra Sangeet* & performing dance numbers, composed by them.





Observing Global Accessibility Awareness Day (GAAD): An awareness programme was organized on 18th May 2023 at Majerhat Young Club, Halder Mandal Para, Mograhat, District - South 24 Parganas, State - West Bengal, Pin. - 743355, near the house of one Present Beneficiary. The programme was organized by Paripurnata and conducted by Smt. Jhuma Bhatta, Programme Coordinator cum Psychologist and Shri B.S. Bhattacharjee, Psychiatric Social Worker. During the 3 hour session attended by about 30 persons, the audience were made aware of the history of Paripurnata and its approach to the rehabilitation process. The idea of the programme was to sensitise

people on mental illness and its early identification. Also the aim was to eradicate the myths prevailing in the community and also to minimise the stigma in regards to mental illness.

Observing World Schizophrenia Day: A seminar on Schizophrenia was organized on 24th May 2023 at Paripurnata. During the 2 hour session attended by about 50 persons, the speaker was Dr. Japasish Chakroborty. Introduction of the topic was made by Mr. Bidhan Chandra Chakrabarti, Hony Secretary. Discussion on Schizophrenia as a serious mental illness that affects how a person thinks, feels, and behaves, Signs & Symptoms and Treatment. Programme was



conducted by Mr. Briti Sundar Bhattacharjee, Psychiatric Social Worker and vote of thanks given by Ms. Jhuma Bhatta, Programme Cordinator-cum-Psychologist. Programme ended with light refreshments.



Observing International Yoga Day: A Programme on Yoga was organized on 21st June 2023 at Paripurnata to observe the day. Ms. Malobika Saha Bhowmick, Yoga Therapist of Paripurnata conducted the programme along with the beneficiaries of Paripurnata. Mr. Bidhan Chandra Chakrabarti, Hony Secretary of Paripurnata gave a brief lecture on importance of Yoga. Mr. Briti Sundar Bhattacharjee,

Psychiatric Social Worker anchored the Programme. Two types of Yoga were performed by the beneficiaries of Paripurnata, along with Ms. Malobika Saha Bhowmick. Vote of thanks was given by Ms. Jhuma Bhatta, Programme Coordinator-cum-Psychologist. The duration of the programme was 1 hour & nearly 40 persons attended the programme. Programme ended with light refreshment for all participants.

Observing World Drug Day: A Programme on Drug Abuse was organized on 26th June 2023 at Paripurnata in-collaboration with Neotia Academy of Nursing. This year theme was "*People first: stop stigma and discrimination, strengthen prevention*". It was attend by 70 persons. During 2 hours sessions the topic was thoroughly discussed.

Puppet Show: A Puppet show was organized by DANA on 29th July 2023 at Paripurnata. Introduction of the show was made by Mr. Bidhan Chandra Chakrabarti, Hony. Secretary. During 2 hour show our beneficiaries actively participated and enjoyed.

Celebration of Foundation Day of Paripurnata: 32nd Foundation Day of Paripurnata held on 8th August 2023 was kicked off with the Cake Cutting Ceremony at our Sovarani Sil & Banamali Sil Memorial Hall in which the beneficiaries and staff members participated. Mr. Bidhan Chandra Chakrabarti and Mr. Prasanta Kumar Dey delivered short speeches on struggle and History of Paripurnata also Ms. Jhuma Bhatta gave a vote of thanks to the audience.



Independence Day: The 76th anniversary of our Independence was celebrated on 15th August 2023. The celebration commenced

with hoisting of the national flag by Mr. Asok Kumar Sil, Managing Committee Member. The residents confidently rendered patriotic songs & recitations, dance drama. Mr. Bidhan Chandra Chakrabarti delivered a short speech on our freedom struggle and Mr. Asok Kumar Sil gave vote of thanks to the audience.

Swachh Bharat Mission. The following activities were carried out under the Mission "**Swachhata Pledge**" The pledge was taken by all the MC members on 23rd September 2023 and Staff members on 1st October 2023.

Cleanliness drives at office premises and adjacent areas: As a tribute to Mahatma Gandhi on the eve of his birth anniversary, the theme of 'Garbage Free India' was implemented by cleaning the office premises and surrounding areas during the period.

Specific activities and display of banners. Appropriate banners & posters were displayed for awareness of the local population and leaflets on the subject were distributed.



Mental Health Week Celebration: As declared by GoI (7th -12th Oct.), Mental Health Week was celebrated by displaying of posters and banners on mental health issues and illumination of the building. **On 10th October, (observed as the World Mental Health Day)**, an awareness rally was organized in neighboring Panchasayar, Baghajatin and Hiland Park areas. The Residents, the staff members and Instructors of Paripurnata, took part in the rally, led by Shri Bidhan Ch. Chakrabarti, Hony. Secretary of Paripurnata who also delivered a short speech on mental illness at Hiland Park. Leaflets and brochures on mental illness were distributed.

As a part of the Mental Health Week Celebration, an awareness Camp was organised on 12th October 2023, at our office premises. Stalls, exhibiting and selling handicraft and food items made by our beneficiaries were in place. Display of posters and banners were arranged.

On 13th October 2023, Interact Club of Indus Valley World School conducted a cultural session comprising group singing and recitations in which our beneficiaries also actively participated, as part of Mental Health Week.

Inspection Visit: Director of Social Welfare, Smt. Mitali Bandapadhyay, Director and Shri Subhasish Mitra, Section Officer of Social Welfare, Govt of WB visited Paripurnata for inspection without prior notice on 18th October 2023. They thoroughly inspected our infrastructure, books and records of documents. She expressed her satisfaction after the inspection.



Durga Puja Celebration : The residents accompanied by staff and members of Paripurnata including the Secretary, visited some of the famous *puja pandals* in Narendrapur, Garia, Baisnabghata and Patuli area in a chartered bus on Maha Sasthi, 20th October 2023. Refreshment was served during the trip.

Baghajatin Park Puja Committee and Ms. Moushumee Basu Roy, located in the neighbourhood of Paripurnata, invited our residents to the Maha Bhog.

Monthly Film show: Few Hindi & Bengali movies like "Namak Halaal" "Oh My God" etc. were shown to the residents. Light refreshment was served after the show.



Deepabali, the festival of lights was observed by the Residents with customary cheers and gaiety. Well wishers of Paripurnata and people from the neighboring community joined in the festivity, bearing gifts of decorative lamps, candles, fireworks, sweets etc on 12th November 2023. It was indeed a memorable evening for all.



Annual Get-together: The programme was held on 26th November 2023 at Paripurnata. A cultural programme was organised in which the talented residents along with a few staff, Members of Paripurnata and guest artists regaled the overflowing audience. A sumptuous lunch was served after the programme.

Before the cultural programme commenced, Dr. Ratna Sen, the senior-most founder member of Paripurnata, *inaugurated a plaque in our First-floor, in the name of our Founder Secretary, Late Dr. Joyce Siromoni.*

Eye Check-up Camp:

An Eye check-up camp was held at Paripurnataon 29th December 2023, in-collaboration with **SUKRITI**, a welfare association of women entrepreneurs.

Sri Briti Sundar Bhattacharjee (our Psychiatrist Social worker) welcomed and introduced Dr. Shreoshee Ghosh (Eye specialist) and Shri Anirban Sarkar (Ophthalmologist), to the participants, consisting of our residents, staff members and a few ladies from the community, totaling 43 beneficiaries, who were individually checked, advised and received prescriptions. Wholesome food packets were served.

Annual Picnic: Annual Picnic was held on 25th January 2024 for residents of Paripurnata at "**GREEN VALLEY**" Mirpur, Baruipur, Dist. – 24 Pgs. (S). A total of 50 persons, which included our residents, ex-residents, staff members, instructors and a few M.C. members participated. They enthusiastically took part in the various organized programmes. A wholesome Breakfast and Lunch were served.





Annual Sports: The Annual Sports was held on 19th February 2024 at 11.00 a.m. to 4 p.m. for residents of Paripurnata at office ground in which all Staffs, instructors & Hony. Secretary participated. Various new sports were added this year. The participants enjoyed the events. The sports ended with gift and light refreshment to every participant.

International Women's Day: Paripurnata observed the day on 8th March 2024 at the Sovarani & Banamali Sil Memorial Hall at Paripurnata. Mr. Bidhan Ch. Chakrabarti, Hon Secretary of Paripurnata delivered an introductory short speech on International Women's Day. Ms. Jhuma Bhatta, Programme Co-ordinator cum Psychologist also delivered short speech on the event. Our beneficiaries actively participated in the celebration, which included songs, recitations and dance performances by our residents. Mr. Briti Sundar Bhattacharjee- Psychiatric Social Worker-cum- Asset Supervisor gave vote of thanks to the audience.


